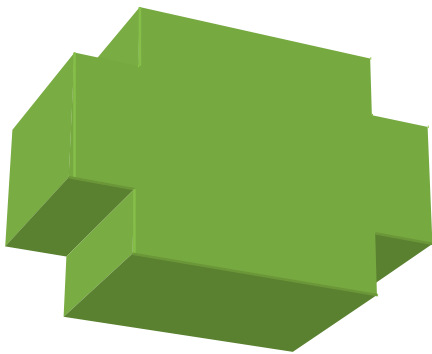
Natural Medicine programs align with a philosophy of healing that values the whole person—mind, body, and spirit—and empowers individuals to support their health naturally.


- **Passion for Holistic Health:** Committed to a holistic approach that treats the root causes of health issues, not just the symptoms.



Pre-Enrollment Requirements

General Requirements:

- English language proficiency
- Secondary education (12 years or equivalent) or mature student/post-secondary transfer
- Canadian citizenship, permanent residency, or legal study authorization
- **Minimum age:** 16
- Applies to domestic students

Pre-Enrollment Process:

- Same criteria for domestic and online applicants

Payment & Pre-Enrollment:

- Non-refundable \$250 application fee
- Fees must be paid during registration periods, with penalties for late payments
- Late registration fee: \$50 per course

Registration Periods:

- **Regular Registration:** Tuition due within 5 business days
- **Late Registration:** Tuition due within 1 business day

Waiting Lists:

- Students have 24 hours to accept/decline available seats
- Accepted seats require payment within specified timeframes based on registration period

Pre-Enrollment Steps:

- Email college at info@newearthcollege.org
- Complete the online pre-admissions form
- **Pre-Enrollment fee:** \$250 (non-refundable)
- Additional remedial courses may be required for non-healthcare/science backgrounds
- **Optional required prerequisites:** Police clearance, criminal background check, notary-verified documents, academic interview based on and according to NEC boards discretion on an individual case basis (Clinical internships & hands on programs may require the prerequisites strictly)
